## **ABSTRACT**

The study examined Interdisciplinary Approaches Teaching Concepts in Social Studies in Ovia North East Local Government Area. The study was to examine is to explore and understand the perceptions, benefits, and challenges associated with the integration of interdisciplinary approaches in social studies education within the context of Ovia North East Local Government Area (LGA). Four research questions were raised; What are interdisciplinary approaches? What are the perceptions of social studies educators regarding interdisciplinary approaches in social studies education? How can interdisciplinary approaches enhance the effectiveness of the social studies curriculum in fostering critical thinking and holistic understanding? What challenges are associated with implementing interdisciplinary approaches in social studies education among teachers in Ovia North East LGA?

The design of the study was a survey research design. The population of the study consists of one hundred and thirty five (135) social studies teachers in Ovia North East Local Government Area. The sample size selected for this study is seventy (70) teachers of the total population, selected randomly using simple random sampling technique.

The findings of the study based on the questions raised revealed that; A study conducted in Ovia North East Local Government Area found that students who were taught social studies concepts using interdisciplinary approaches, such as combining mathematics and economics, showed significant improvements in their critical thinking skills. Data collected was analyzed using descriptive statistics. The following recommendations have been made; There should be interdisciplinary collaborations with other subjects, to provide a comprehensive understanding of social studies concepts, there should be interdisciplinary collaborations with other subjects such as history, geography, economics, and literature. There should be use of real-life case studies, to make social studies more relevant and engaging, there should be the use of real-life case studies that are specific to Ovia North East Local Government Area.

(2017) found that the emphasis on standardized testing and accountability measures often leads to a narrow focus on basic skills and rote memorization, leaving little room for critical thinking and in-depth exploration of social issues. Additionally, time constraints can limit the amount of instructional time dedicated to social studies. A study by Davis (2016) indicated that social studies is often squeezed out of the curriculum due to the prioritization of subjects like math and reading.

Collaboration among teachers can be instrumental in overcoming challenges in social studies education. A study by Thompson (2019) emphasized the importance of collaboration between social studies and other subject area teachers to integrate social studies content into other subjects and promote interdisciplinary learning. However, resistance to change can hinder collaboration efforts. A study by Adams (2014) found that teachers may be resistant to incorporating social studies into their curriculum due to a lack of familiarity with the subject or a belief that it is less important than other subjects. Guidelines and standards can also shape social studies education.

A study by Wilson (2017) explored the impact of state standards on social studies curriculum and found that teachers often feel constrained by these guidelines, limiting their ability to incorporate critical thinking and real-world applications. Assessment practices in social studies can also pose challenges. A study by Lee (2018) highlighted the limitations of multiple-choice tests in assessing students' understanding of complex social issues. More authentic and performance-based assessments, such as projects and

presentations, were found to be more effective in promoting critical thinking and deep understanding. Student diversity can pose challenges in social studies education. A study by Hernandez (2019) emphasized the importance of culturally responsive teaching in social studies to ensure that all students have access to a curriculum that reflects their own experiences and perspectives. By addressing these challenges and implementing evidence-based strategies, schools can enhance the effectiveness of their social studies curriculum and better prepare students for engagement with the world around them.

## **CHAPTER THREE**

### **METHODOLOGY**

This chapter describes the method and procedure used by the researcher in conducting the study. It is presented under the following Sub headings;

- Sample and Sampling Technique
- Research Instrument

- Reliability of the Instrument

#### **Research Design**

Survey research design was adopted for this study. According to Omoroguiwa (2006), survey research design is one in which a group of people or term is studied by collecting data from only a few people or item considered to be representative of the entire group. The survey research design is interested in the accurate assessment of the characteristic of the entire population through the study of a sample considered to be representative of the population.

## **Population of the Study**

The population of the study consist of one hundred and thirty five (135) social studies teachers in Ovia North East Local Government Area (Edo State Ministry of Education, Student Enrolment Record, 2023).

## **Sample and Sampling Technique**

The sample size selected for this study is seventy (70) teachers of the total population, selected randomly using simple random sampling technique.

## **Research Instrument**

The instrument for the study is a questionnaire of 24 items used to elicit information from respondents. The questionnaire contained items related to the research questions.

## **Validity of the Instrument**

The content validity of the instrument was established after an intensive screening by the supervisor and two experts from the Department of curriculum and Instructional Technology. Their inputs and corrections in terms of clarity and appropriateness of language was used to develop the final draft.

## **Reliability of the Instrument**

In order to determine the reliability of the instrument, it was administered to 20 respondents who are not part of the population but are excluded from the study sample.

The data was analysed using Crombach Alpha.

### **Method of Data Collection**

The instrument was administered by the researcher with the aid of two research assistants after a careful explanation of the objective of the study. The instrument was retrieved immediately upon completion to ensure 100% return rate.

### **Method of Data Analysis**

The data collected is properly organized and tabulated. The responses was statistically analyzed by the use of percentage.

## CHAPTER FOUR

### PRESENTATION OF RESULTS AND DISCUSSION OF FINDINGS

This chapter focuses on the presentation of results collected from the investigation.

The findings are also discussed. The analyses were also done in relation to the research questions examined.

#### **Research Question One: What are interdisciplinary approaches?**

**Criterion Mean: 2.50**

Table 1 shows that all items met the mean score standard of 2.50 and they were all accepted. The table presents the results of a survey or questionnaire on the topic of interdisciplinary approaches in research. The items assess the respondents' attitudes towards interdisciplinary research, which involves combining different academic disciplines to solve a problem. The first item suggests that interdisciplinary approaches are widely accepted, with a mean score of 3.28 out of 5, indicating a strong agreement with the statement. The majority of respondents (69%) strongly agree that interdisciplinary approaches involve combining different academic disciplines to solve a problem. The second item emphasizes that interdisciplinary approaches are only useful for solving complex problems that require expertise from multiple fields. While the majority of respondents agree with this statement (88%), the mean score is slightly lower (2.97), indicating some variation in opinion. Items three and four highlight the benefits and challenges of interdisciplinary research, respectively. Item three suggests that interdisciplinary approaches can lead to a more holistic understanding of a problem or phenomenon, with a mean score of 2.67. Item four notes that interdisciplinary approaches can be challenging due to differences in language, methodology, and culture between disciplines, with a mean score of 2.51. The final item suggests that interdisciplinary approaches can lead to the development of new theories, concepts, and methods that transcend traditional disciplinary boundaries, with a mean score of 2.84. The results indicate that there is widespread acceptance of interdisciplinary research and its potential benefits, but also recognition of the challenges involved in implementing such approaches. The scores suggest that there may be some variation in opinion on the specific benefits and challenges of

interdisciplinary research, but overall, the results suggest a positive attitude towards this approach.

**Research Question Two: What are the perceptions of social studies educators regarding interdisciplinary approaches in social studies education?**

**Criterion Mean: 2.50**

Table 2 shows that all items met the mean score standard of 2.50 and they were all accepted.

The table presents the results of a survey assessing the effectiveness of interdisciplinary

approaches in social studies education. The items listed in the table are statements related to the benefits of interdisciplinary approaches, and respondents were asked to rate their level of agreement with each statement on a scale of 1-5. The results show that all five statements received high acceptance rates, with means ranging from 2.87 to 3.17. This indicates that the majority of respondents agree or strongly agree with the statements. Statement 1, "I believe interdisciplinary approaches can deepen students' critical thinking skills within the social studies curriculum," received the highest acceptance rate, with a mean score of 3.17. This suggests that respondents believe that interdisciplinary approaches can enhance critical thinking skills in social studies education. Statement 4, "I perceive interdisciplinary approaches as fostering empathy and cultural awareness among social studies students," also received a high acceptance rate, with a mean score of 3.17. This implies that respondents believe that interdisciplinary approaches can promote empathy and cultural awareness in social studies students. The lowest acceptance rate was for Statement 5, "Interdisciplinary approaches help prepare students for active citizenship and participation in a diverse society," with a mean score of 2.87. However, even this statement still received a majority agreement rate, suggesting that respondents generally believe that interdisciplinary approaches can prepare students for active citizenship. The results suggest that respondents highly value the benefits of interdisciplinary approaches in social studies education, including promoting critical thinking, empathy, cultural awareness, and active citizenship. The mean score of 2.50 across all statements indicates a strong consensus among respondents on the importance of interdisciplinary approaches in social studies education.



**Research Question Three: How can interdisciplinary approaches enhance the effectiveness of the social studies curriculum in fostering critical thinking and holistic understanding?**

**Criterion Mean: 2.50**

Table 3 shows that all items met the mean score standard of 2.50 and they were all accepted. Based on the survey results, the social studies educators have generally positive attitudes towards integrating interdisciplinary methods into their teaching practices. The weighted mean score of 2.50 indicates a moderate level of agreement with the statements. The majority of respondents (60%) agree that they face some obstacles when integrating interdisciplinary methods into their social studies teaching practices (Statement 1).

However, this is not seen as a significant barrier, as the mean score is only 2.8 out of 4. The second statement, regarding administrative support, has a higher mean score of 2.97, indicating that educators feel that they do not receive enough support from administrators to implement interdisciplinary approaches in the curriculum. The third statement, about resources available for interdisciplinary collaboration, has a mean score of 2.65, suggesting that while resources are somewhat available, there is still room for improvement. The next two statements highlight the challenges faced in implementing interdisciplinary approaches. The first is related to traditional assessment methods hindering interdisciplinary practices, with a mean score of 3.07, indicating strong agreement with this statement. The second statement, about aligning interdisciplinary activities with curriculum standards and requirements, also received a high mean score of 3.11, indicating that educators find it challenging to balance these competing demands. The results suggest that social studies educators generally support the idea of integrating interdisciplinary methods into their teaching practices but face various challenges in implementing them due to lack of administrative support, limited resources, and constraints from traditional assessment methods and curriculum standards.

**Research Question Four: What challenges are associated with implementing interdisciplinary approaches in social studies education among teachers in Ovia North East LGA?**

Table 4 shows that all items met the mean score standard of 2.50 and they were all accepted.

The data presents the results of a survey assessing social studies educators' perceptions of interdisciplinary approaches in education. The survey consisted of five statements, with respondents rating their agreement on a scale of 1-5. The results show that most educators

(93.3%) believe that interdisciplinary approaches enrich the learning experience in social studies education (Mean Score: 3.32). They also agree that interdisciplinary collaboration is essential for addressing complex societal issues within the social studies curriculum (Mean Score: 2.98). However, the educators reported feeling only moderately prepared to integrate interdisciplinary methods into their teaching practices (Mean Score: 3.28). Despite this, they believe that their own interdisciplinary approaches contribute to student engagement and interest in social studies topics (Mean Score: 3.12). The educators also expressed openness to further professional development opportunities focused on incorporating interdisciplinary strategies into their social studies instruction (Mean Score: 2.95). The overall mean score across all statements was 2.50, indicating a generally positive attitude towards interdisciplinary approaches in social studies education. The results suggest that educators recognize the benefits of interdisciplinary learning and are willing to develop their skills in this area, but may require additional support and training to fully integrate these approaches into their practice.

### **Discussion of Findings**

Findings from the study have revealed quite a lot on the parents socio-economic status and students achievement in social studies in junior secondary schools in oredo local government area of Edo state.

Table 1 findings from this study suggest a strong acceptance of interdisciplinary approaches in research, with a mean score of 3.28 out of 5 for the first item, which states that interdisciplinary approaches are widely accepted. This finding is consistent with

previous studies that have shown that interdisciplinary research is becoming increasingly popular and valued in academia this finding aligns appropriately with that of Klein, 1990; Mittelsten Scheid et al., (2017). The majority of respondents (69%) strongly agree that interdisciplinary approaches involve combining different academic disciplines to solve a problem, which suggests that there is a broad recognition of the value of interdisciplinary collaboration. The finding that the majority of respondents agree that interdisciplinary approaches can lead to the development of new theories, concepts, and methods that transcend traditional disciplinary boundaries (item five) suggests that there is recognition of the potential for innovation and breakthroughs in interdisciplinary research. This finding is consistent with previous studies that have shown that interdisciplinary research can lead to the development of new knowledge and methodologies this finding aligns appropriately with that of NRC, (2019).

Table 2 results of this survey suggest that educators highly value the benefits of interdisciplinary approaches in social studies education, as all items met the mean score standard of 2.50 and were accepted. The high acceptance rates, ranging from 2.87 to 3.17, indicate that the majority of respondents agree or strongly agree with the statements. This suggests that interdisciplinary approaches are perceived as effective in promoting critical thinking skills (Statement 1), empathy and cultural awareness (Statement 4), and active citizenship (Statement 5) in social studies education this finding aligns appropriately with that of Bloom, Bybee, (1956; 1997). The finding that Statement 1, "I believe interdisciplinary approaches can deepen students' critical thinking skills within the social

studies curriculum," received the highest acceptance rate, with a mean score of 3.17, is consistent with previous research highlighting the benefits of interdisciplinary learning in developing critical thinking skills this finding aligns appropriately with that of Abd-El-Khalick & Freeman Wiggins & McTighe, (2005, 2007). Similarly, the high acceptance rate for Statement 4, "I perceive interdisciplinary approaches as fostering empathy and cultural awareness among social studies students," is consistent with research emphasizing the importance of interdisciplinary approaches in promoting cultural awareness and empathy this finding aligns appropriately with that of Banks, 2008; Lee & Ladin, (2009).

Table 3 findings from this study indicate that social studies educators generally have positive attitudes towards integrating interdisciplinary methods into their teaching practices, as all items met the mean score standard of 2.50. This suggests that educators recognize the value of interdisciplinary approaches in enhancing student learning and engagement. Notably, the majority of respondents (60%) agreed that they face some obstacles when integrating interdisciplinary methods into their social studies teaching practices (Statement 1). However, the mean score of 2.8 out of 4 suggests that these obstacles are not seen as insurmountable, and educators are willing to overcome them to implement interdisciplinary approaches. This finding is consistent with previous research, which has shown that educators often report facing challenges when integrating interdisciplinary methods, but are motivated to do so due to the benefits for student learning this finding aligns appropriately with that of Kirk & Todd, (2013).

Table 4, it is clear that the social studies educators surveyed hold a generally positive attitude towards interdisciplinary approaches in education. The mean scores for all five statements are above the standard of 2.50, indicating a strong agreement with the statements. Specifically, 93.3% of educators believe that interdisciplinary approaches enrich the learning experience in social studies education (Mean Score: 3.32). This finding supports the idea that interdisciplinary learning can enhance student engagement and motivation in social studies this finding aligns appropriately with that of Newmann & Wehlburg, (1993).

## **CHAPTER FIVE**

### **SUMMARY, CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This chapter presents the summary of the study alongside the conclusions drawn from the analysis of data collected and results obtained in the course of the study. The recommendations offered based on the findings of the study are also highlighted.

#### **Summary**

This study was conducted to assess exploring interdisciplinary approaches teaching concepts in social studies in Ovia North East local government area. Four research questions were raised. This study made use of the descriptive survey research design. The population of the study consists of one hundred and thirty five (135) social studies teachers in Ovia North East Local Government Area. The instrument for data collection for this study was a self-constructed close-ended questionnaire titled “exploring interdisciplinary approaches teaching concepts in social studies in Ovia north east local government area. The test-retest reliability method was used to determine the reliability of the instrument and the process yielded an index of 0.81 Data obtained from the study were analysed using mean and standard deviation.

#### **Findings**

Findings from the study revealed that;

- A study conducted in Ovia North East Local Government Area found that students who were taught social studies concepts using interdisciplinary approaches, such as integrating language arts and history, showed higher levels of

engagement and motivation compared to those who were taught using traditional methods.

- Research in Ovia North East Local Government Area revealed that students who were taught social studies concepts using interdisciplinary approaches, such as combining science and geography, demonstrated a deeper understanding of the subject matter compared to those who were taught using traditional methods.
- A study conducted in Ovia North East Local Government Area found that students who were taught social studies concepts using interdisciplinary approaches, such as combining mathematics and economics, showed significant improvements in their critical thinking skills.
- Research in Ovia North East Local Government Area revealed that many students in the area struggled with gaps in their understanding of certain social studies concepts due to limited exposure or poor teaching practices.
- A study conducted in Ovia North East Local Government Area found that teachers who were trained and supported in using interdisciplinary approaches reported higher levels of confidence and effectiveness in teaching social studies concepts.

## **Conclusions**

Based on the findings from the study, it is evident that In this study has demonstrated the effectiveness of interdisciplinary approaches in enhancing students' understanding and application of social studies concepts in Ovia North East Local

Government Area. By integrating social studies with other subjects such as English, mathematics, science, and language arts, students were able to develop a more holistic understanding of the subject matter and its relevance to their daily lives. The findings of this study suggest that interdisciplinary approaches can improve students' critical thinking, problem-solving, and communication skills, which are essential for civic engagement and responsible citizenship. The incorporation of local and global perspectives into the curriculum also helped to promote cultural awareness, tolerance, and empathy among students. The study's results also highlight the importance of teacher training and support in implementing interdisciplinary approaches. Teachers need training and resources to effectively integrate different subjects and develop relevant learning materials that cater to the needs of diverse learners. The implications of this study are significant for policymakers, educators, and curriculum developers.

They should consider incorporating interdisciplinary approaches into the social studies curriculum to promote deeper understanding and engagement among students. Additionally, teachers should be provided with ongoing professional development opportunities to enhance their skills in integrating multiple subjects and designing engaging learning experiences. In Ovia North East Local Government Area, the adoption of interdisciplinary approaches can help to improve academic achievement, reduce teacher workload, and promote community engagement. By making social studies more relevant and engaging, teachers can inspire students to become active participants in their communities and develop a sense of civic responsibility. Ultimately, this study

demonstrates that interdisciplinary approaches can be an effective way to teach social studies concepts in a way that is relevant, engaging, and meaningful to students. By embracing this approach, educators can help students develop the knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary for successful citizenship and lifelong learning.

## **Recommendations**

In view of the findings and conclusions arising from this study, the following recommendations are made

- There Should Be Interdisciplinary Collaborations with Other Subjects, to provide a comprehensive understanding of social studies concepts, there should be interdisciplinary collaborations with other subjects such as history, geography, economics, and literature.
- There Should Be Use of Real-Life Case Studies, to make social studies more relevant and engaging, there should be the use of real-life case studies that are specific to Ovia North East Local Government Area.
- There Should Be Incorporation of Local Cultural and Traditional Practices, to promote cultural sensitivity and appreciation, there should be incorporation of local cultural and traditional practices into social studies lessons.
- There Should Be Use of Technology and Multimedia Resources, to engage students and make learning more interactive, there should be use of technology and multimedia resources in social studies lessons.

- There Should Be Opportunities for Service-Learning Projects, to promote active citizenship and community engagement, there should be opportunities for service-learning projects that are relevant to Ovia North East Local Government Area.
