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ABSTRACT

This study examined the impact of Social Studies education on the cultural awareness and diversity appreciation of students in junior secondary schools in Egor Local Government Area, Edo State. The research was guided by four specific objectives, which included determining how Social Studies education influences students' understanding of cultural diversity, assessing the extent to which it fosters appreciation for different languages and religions, examining how the Social Studies curriculum promotes empathy and respect towards diverse cultural backgrounds, and evaluating students' perceptions of its role in shaping their attitudes toward multiculturalism.

Descriptive survey research design was employed, with a sample size of one hundred (100) junior secondary school students randomly selected from the twelve public schools in the area. The study instrument, a structured questionnaire titled "The Impact of Social Studies Education on Students' Cultural Awareness and Diversity Appreciation (ISSESCADA)," was used to collect data. The questionnaire underwent expert validation and was piloted on twenty JSS III students, yielding a Cronbach's alpha coefficient of 0.83, indicating strong reliability. Data were analyzed using mean scores, frequency counts, and standard deviation, with a decision rule set at a mean threshold of 2.50.

The findings of the study revealed that Social Studies education significantly contributes to students' cultural awareness, with the majority of the respondents agreeing that the subject helps them understand the importance of cultural diversity and promotes respect for other cultures. Furthermore, it was found that Social Studies education enhances students' appreciation for various languages and religions, while also fostering empathy and respect for individuals from diverse cultural backgrounds. The study also demonstrated that Social Studies education plays a crucial role in shaping students' attitudes toward multiculturalism, as many respondents noted that the subject encourages them to accept people from different ethnic and cultural groups. However, despite these positive findings, some respondents expressed reservations regarding the extent to which the curriculum provides an in-depth exploration of specific cultural traditions. This suggests that while Social Studies effectively promotes general cultural awareness, there is room for improvement in the area of practical engagement with diverse cultural practices. Based on these findings, the study recommends that the Social Studies curriculum in junior secondary schools be enriched with more culturally immersive activities and real-life examples to enhance students' understanding and appreciation of diverse cultural traditions. Additionally, educators were encourage the active participation of students in discussions and projects centered on cultural diversity, as this will further strengthen their empathy, respect, and openness toward people from different cultural backgrounds.

CHAPTER ONE

INTRODUCTION

Background of the Study

The relevance of social studies education in fostering cultural awareness and diversity appreciation among students has garnered significant attention in recent years. Social studies education is a critical component of the curriculum in many educational systems worldwide, as it equips students with the knowledge and skills necessary to understand societal structures, values, and relationships (Banks, 2020). By integrating various dimensions of history, geography, civics, and sociology, social studies education serves as a vital medium for promoting cultural sensitivity and a deeper appreciation for the diverse social fabric of societies. In the increasingly globalized world of the 21st century, where interactions among different cultures have become more frequent, the need for cultural competence and respect for diversity has never been more paramount. As such, educational curricula that prioritize social studies can have a profound impact on shaping students' perspectives, promoting inclusive thinking, and encouraging tolerance of differences.

Cultural awareness refers to an individual's understanding of the differences and similarities that exist among cultures. It is the ability to recognize and respect the values, customs, and beliefs of people from different cultural backgrounds. Social studies education plays a crucial role in enhancing students' cultural awareness by providing them with historical and contemporary insights into the cultural heritage of various societies. Through this process, students learn to appreciate the complex social dynamics that contribute to cultural identities and practices (Gay, 2021). By learning about different

cultures and their contributions to global civilization, students are not only able to appreciate cultural diversity but are also empowered to challenge stereotypes and prejudices. Moreover, cultural awareness fosters empathy and understanding, which are essential for creating cohesive and harmonious multicultural societies. It is within this context that social studies education becomes indispensable for students' holistic development as global citizens.

Diversity appreciation, on the other hand, extends beyond merely recognizing the existence of different cultures to actively valuing and celebrating these differences. It involves recognizing the positive contributions that cultural diversity makes to societies in terms of innovation, social cohesion, and problem-solving (Nieto, 2019). Social studies education provides students with a platform to explore the concept of diversity from multiple perspectives, including ethnic, racial, religious, and gender diversity. Through this exploration, students are able to develop an appreciation for the richness that diverse cultures bring to societal development. Furthermore, by engaging with topics such as human rights, equality, and social justice, social studies helps to inculcate values of fairness and inclusion among students. This is especially important in multicultural societies where there is a need for mutual respect and understanding among individuals from diverse backgrounds (Sleeter & Carmona, 2021).

Over the past few decades, there has been a growing emphasis on the role of education in fostering social cohesion and promoting cultural diversity. Social studies, with its multidisciplinary nature, is uniquely positioned to contribute to this goal. According to Banks (2020), social studies education is instrumental in preparing students to function effectively in a pluralistic society. The curriculum provides opportunities for students to

engage with diverse viewpoints, challenge their own assumptions, and develop a critical understanding of how cultural, social, and political factors shape human experiences. This critical engagement is vital for developing students' capacity to interact positively with people from different cultural backgrounds, thereby fostering an inclusive and tolerant society. The importance of social studies education in promoting cultural awareness and diversity appreciation is underscored by the growing diversity in many countries' populations. In Nigeria, for instance, the multicultural nature of the society presents both opportunities and challenges for fostering national unity. According to Obanya (2022), social studies education in Nigeria has been instrumental in promoting national integration by teaching students about the country's diverse ethnic and cultural groups. The curriculum provides a framework for understanding the historical and social factors that have shaped the country's multicultural identity, thereby helping students to appreciate the value of diversity in nation-building.

Social studies education promotes a sense of belonging among students by encouraging them to see themselves as part of a larger social and cultural community. Similarly, in the United States, social studies education has been recognized as a powerful tool for promoting cultural pluralism and diversity appreciation. Gay (2021) highlights the role of culturally responsive teaching in social studies as a means of addressing the educational needs of students from diverse cultural backgrounds. Culturally responsive teaching involves the use of teaching strategies that recognize and value students' cultural identities and experiences. By incorporating diverse cultural perspectives into the curriculum, social studies educators can create an inclusive learning environment that respects and values the contributions of all students. This approach not only enhances

students' academic achievement but also fosters their social and emotional development by promoting a sense of belonging and self-worth.

In addition to promoting cultural awareness and diversity appreciation, social studies education also plays a key role in preparing students for active citizenship. One of the fundamental goals of social studies is to equip students with the knowledge, skills, and values necessary for effective participation in democratic societies (Parker, 2020). Through the study of topics such as government, law, and civic responsibility, students learn about their rights and responsibilities as citizens. They also develop critical thinking skills that enable them to analyze social and political issues from multiple perspectives. This critical engagement with societal issues is essential for fostering informed and engaged citizens who are capable of contributing to the development of just and equitable societies. As Parker (2020) notes, social studies education is not only about transmitting knowledge but also about empowering students to become active and responsible citizens who are committed to promoting the common good.

Despite the many benefits of social studies education in promoting cultural awareness and diversity appreciation, there are challenges that need to be addressed. One of the key challenges is the lack of emphasis on cultural diversity in some social studies curricula. In many cases, the curriculum tends to focus more on national history and identity, with little attention given to the cultural diversity within the country or the global context (Banks, 2020). This narrow focus can limit students' understanding of the complexities of cultural interactions and reduce their ability to appreciate the contributions of diverse cultures to societal development. To address this challenge, there is a need for a more inclusive approach to social studies education that reflects the multicultural realities

of modern societies. This can be achieved by incorporating more diverse cultural perspectives into the curriculum and by providing opportunities for students to engage with global issues related to culture and diversity.

Another challenge is the lack of teacher preparation for teaching cultural diversity in social studies. According to Sleeter and Carmona (2021), many social studies teachers are not adequately trained to address the cultural diversity of their students. As a result, they may struggle to create inclusive learning environments that respect and value the cultural identities of all students. To overcome this challenge, there is a need for more professional development opportunities for social studies teachers to enhance their cultural competence and teaching skills. This can include training on culturally responsive teaching strategies, as well as opportunities for teachers to learn about the cultural backgrounds of their students. It is against this backdrop that this study seeks to examine the Impact of Social Studies Education on Students' Cultural Awareness and Diversity Appreciation.

Statement of the Problem

Despite the critical role of social studies education in fostering cultural awareness and diversity appreciation, there is a growing concern that many students continue to lack adequate understanding and respect for cultural differences. In increasingly multicultural societies, intolerance, stereotypes, and prejudice remain prevalent, often fueled by a lack of exposure to diverse cultural perspectives. The gap between the intended objectives of social studies curricula and the actual outcomes in students' cultural competence is evident. This discrepancy calls into question the effectiveness of current social studies education in equipping students with the skills and knowledge necessary to navigate and appreciate

diverse cultural landscapes. Therefore, this study seeks to investigate the Impact of Social Studies Education on Students' Cultural Awareness and Diversity Appreciation.

Research Questions

The following questions were raised to guide the study:

1. How does social studies education influence students' understanding of cultural diversity?
2. What impact does social studies education have on students' appreciation for different languages and religions?
3. In what ways do social studies curricula promote empathy and respect towards diverse cultural backgrounds among students?
4. How do students perceive the role of social studies education in shaping their attitudes towards multiculturalism?

Purpose of the Study

The main purpose of this study was to determine the Impact of Social Studies Education on Students' Cultural Awareness and Diversity Appreciation. Specifically, the study determined:

1. how social studies education influences students' understanding of cultural diversity.
2. the impact of social studies education on students' appreciation for different languages and religions.
3. the ways in which social studies curricula promote empathy and respect towards diverse cultural backgrounds among students.
4. how students' perceptions of the role of social studies education in shaping their attitudes towards multiculturalism.

Hypothesis

Research questions two, three, and four will be answered directly, while research question one was hypothesized thus:

Ho1: There is no significant relationship between social studies education and students' understanding of cultural diversity.

Significance of the Study

The findings of this study when published in reputable journals, conference proceedings or workshops, will be of immense benefit to, Social Studies Education students, lecturers, school administrators, policy makers, and future researchers. First, students stand to gain the most as Social Studies Education plays a crucial role in enhancing their understanding of cultural differences and promoting tolerance. By engaging with the subject, students develop a deeper awareness of their own cultural identity and gain respect for the cultural backgrounds of others. This knowledge fosters mutual respect and reduces instances of prejudice, thereby creating a more harmonious and inclusive school environment. Furthermore, these students are likely to carry forward this understanding into adulthood, contributing positively to a multicultural society.

In addition, lecturers will benefit from the findings as they can use the research insights to tailor their teaching methods and curriculum content. By understanding the areas where students may lack cultural awareness or struggle with diversity appreciation, lecturers can modify their instructional strategies to better meet these needs. This will not only make the teaching of Social Studies more effective but will also ensure that the curriculum remains relevant and responsive to contemporary societal issues.

Moreover, school administrators will find the research beneficial in creating policies that promote cultural inclusivity and diversity appreciation within schools. The findings can guide the development of programs and extracurricular activities that encourage cultural exchange and dialogue among students, helping to create an atmosphere that celebrates diversity. Such programs can also reduce conflicts and foster unity in a diverse student population, which is a critical objective for administrators aiming to maintain a peaceful school environment.

For policymakers, the research offers valuable insights into the broader impact of Social Studies Education on societal cohesion. By understanding how Social Studies influences students' attitudes towards culture and diversity, policymakers can advocate for its strengthened role in the national curriculum. This can lead to educational reforms that prioritize cultural competence and inclusivity, essential for fostering a more tolerant and progressive society.

Finally, future researchers will benefit from this study as it will provide a foundation for further exploration of the role of education in promoting cultural awareness. The findings can serve as a reference point for subsequent studies.

Scope and Delimitation of the Study

The scope of the study was hinged on the Impact of Social Studies Education on Students' Cultural Awareness and Diversity Appreciation. The study is delimited to JSS III students in Egor Local Government Area of Edo State.

- **Social Studies Education:** Social studies education refers to an academic discipline that focuses on the study of society and its various components, including history, geography, politics, and culture, aimed at preparing students for responsible citizenship.
- **Cultural Awareness:** Cultural awareness is the recognition and understanding of the differences and similarities between cultures, including their beliefs, practices, and values.
- **Diversity Appreciation:** Diversity appreciation is the recognition, respect, and value of the unique qualities, perspectives, and contributions of people from different cultural, racial, ethnic, and social backgrounds.
- **Students:** Students refer to individuals enrolled in educational institutions who are engaged in learning and academic activities, particularly in social studies education in this context.
- **Impact:** Impact refers to the measurable effects or influence that social studies education has on students' understanding and appreciation of cultural diversity.
- **Cultural Diversity:** Cultural diversity refers to the existence of a variety of cultural or ethnic groups within a society, contributing to its social and cultural richness.

Social Studies Education

Social Studies Education is a multidisciplinary field that integrates various aspects of social sciences to promote civic competence and foster an understanding of societal dynamics. This discipline focuses on developing students' ability to make informed decisions as citizens of a culturally diverse, democratic society in an interdependent world. The ultimate aim of Social Studies Education is to create responsible citizens who can actively contribute to society through an understanding of historical, geographical, political, economic, and cultural concepts (Martorella, Beal, & Bolick, 2022). It is through this blend of subjects that Social Studies equips learners with the tools to critically analyze societal

issues, understand the interconnectedness of global events, and participate meaningfully in civic life.

The core of Social Studies Education lies in its ability to foster critical thinking, problem-solving, and decision-making skills. Learners are encouraged to engage with content in ways that promote inquiry and investigation, which helps them to understand their role in society. According to Parker (2019), Social Studies is more than just a collection of facts and figures; it is a process that involves cultivating a sense of moral and ethical responsibility towards the community. Students learn to evaluate different perspectives, assess the credibility of sources, and make judgments that are informed by a deep understanding of societal structures and issues. By doing so, they become more adept at understanding complex issues such as governance, human rights, and social justice.

Social Studies Education emphasizes the importance of democratic values, human rights, and social justice. According to Banks (2020), the subject plays a pivotal role in nurturing students' understanding of democracy by fostering a commitment to civic participation and ethical behavior. It provides a platform for students to explore the fundamental principles of equality, freedom, and justice, thereby encouraging them to take part in shaping a more just and equitable society. By studying historical events and contemporary issues, students are able to draw connections between past and present societal challenges and develop a greater awareness of their civic duties.

The interdisciplinary nature of Social Studies allows it to cover a wide range of topics, including history, geography, political science, economics, and sociology. This diversity enables students to develop a holistic understanding of the world around them. As noted by Ross (2021), Social Studies Education helps students make sense of their social

environment and equips them with the skills needed to adapt to changing societal conditions. The integration of geography and history, for example, enables learners to understand the spatial and temporal dimensions of human existence, while the inclusion of political science and economics provides insight into how societies are governed and how resources are distributed. In addition, Social Studies Education contributes to the development of global citizenship by encouraging students to think beyond their immediate environment and engage with global issues. According to Merryfield (2020), the concept of global citizenship is becoming increasingly relevant in today's interconnected world, and Social Studies provides the framework for students to understand their role in a global context. Through the study of international relations, human rights, and global economies, learners gain an appreciation of global interdependence and the importance of cooperation in addressing global challenges such as climate change, poverty, and conflict.

Concept of Cultural Awareness

Cultural awareness refers to the understanding and recognition of the differences between cultures, which includes the values, beliefs, norms, and behaviors that shape individuals' worldviews. It is an essential component in global interactions, facilitating effective communication and fostering mutual respect among people from diverse cultural backgrounds. The concept of cultural awareness has gained prominence due to the increasing globalization and interconnectedness of the world, where individuals and organizations often interact with people from various cultural settings. Developing cultural awareness allows individuals to navigate intercultural interactions with sensitivity, reducing the potential for misunderstandings and conflicts, and promoting inclusion and collaboration in multicultural environments (Matsumoto & Juang, 2020). According to

Deardorff (2021), cultural awareness is a key element of intercultural competence, which involves the ability to communicate and behave appropriately and effectively in intercultural situations. Deardorff emphasizes that cultural awareness is not just about recognizing differences but also about understanding one's own cultural lens and how it influences perceptions and interactions. This self-awareness is crucial for individuals to engage in reflective thinking and adapt their behavior when interacting with people from different cultures. Deardorff's model of intercultural competence includes several stages, with cultural awareness being foundational to the development of other competencies, such as empathy, flexibility, and tolerance for ambiguity (Deardorff, 2021).

One significant aspect of cultural awareness is the recognition of cultural dimensions, which provide a framework for understanding the values that underlie behaviors in different societies. Hofstede's cultural dimensions theory, for example, highlights key differences between cultures in terms of individualism versus collectivism, power distance, uncertainty avoidance, masculinity versus femininity, and long-term versus short-term orientation (Hofstede, 2020). These dimensions offer insight into how people from various cultural backgrounds might approach issues like authority, risk-taking, gender roles, and time management. Hofstede's research has shown that understanding these cultural dimensions can help individuals and organizations avoid ethnocentric judgments and create strategies for more effective cross-cultural communication and collaboration.

Cultural awareness is also critical in educational settings, where teachers and students often come from diverse cultural backgrounds. According to Gay (2021), culturally responsive teaching emphasizes the importance of incorporating students' cultural experiences into the learning process to make education more inclusive and

effective. Gay argues that teachers need to be aware of their students' cultural identities and how these influence learning styles, communication patterns, and classroom behavior. By integrating cultural awareness into the curriculum and pedagogical practices, educators can create an environment where all students feel respected and valued, which enhances engagement and academic achievement (Gay, 2021). Furthermore, in the workplace, cultural awareness is increasingly recognized as a valuable skill in managing diverse teams and working in global markets. As Thomas and Peterson (2020) explain, cultural awareness helps managers understand the diverse needs and expectations of their employees, clients, and partners. In a globalized business environment, where teams are often composed of individuals from different cultural backgrounds, cultural awareness enables leaders to foster an inclusive workplace culture, improve communication, and enhance team collaboration. Thomas and Peterson (2020) highlight that organizations with a high level of cultural awareness are better positioned to innovate and succeed in international markets.

Concept of Diversity Appreciation

Diversity appreciation is a multidimensional concept that involves recognizing, understanding, and valuing the differences and similarities between individuals across various dimensions such as race, ethnicity, gender, religion, age, socioeconomic status, sexual orientation, abilities, and cultural backgrounds. In contemporary society, the significance of diversity appreciation has gained increasing attention, particularly in multicultural environments such as workplaces, schools, and communities, where diversity is not only present but also crucial to fostering an inclusive and harmonious atmosphere. Diversity appreciation extends beyond mere tolerance of differences; it embodies an active engagement in understanding the experiences, values, and perspectives of individuals from

diverse backgrounds. This concept is grounded in the belief that diversity, when appreciated and embraced, enhances creativity, problem-solving, and decision-making within groups and organizations (Mor Barak, 2021).

The importance of diversity appreciation in organizations and educational institutions has been underscored by numerous studies. For instance, Shore et al. (2019) argued that appreciating diversity is central to developing inclusive environments where individuals feel valued and respected for their unique contributions. This is especially important in globalized workplaces where people from different cultural and ethnic backgrounds collaborate. When diversity is appreciated, individuals are more likely to engage in creative thinking, which leads to innovation and improved organizational performance. Shore and her colleagues further suggested that diversity appreciation enhances social cohesion and reduces interpersonal conflicts by fostering mutual respect and understanding among diverse groups.

In education, diversity appreciation plays a critical role in shaping students' perspectives on global citizenship and intercultural competence. According to Banks (2020), when students are exposed to diverse cultures and ideas in the classroom, they are more likely to develop a deeper understanding of the complexities of the world around them. This understanding fosters empathy, respect for differences, and the ability to work effectively with people from diverse backgrounds. Educators who actively promote diversity appreciation in their teaching practices help students develop the skills necessary for success in a globalized world. Banks (2020) emphasized that such an approach to education helps bridge the gap between students from different cultural and socioeconomic backgrounds, leading to more equitable educational outcomes. In addition to its benefits for

social cohesion and innovation, diversity appreciation is closely linked to the concept of equity and inclusion. Turner and González (2022) pointed out that appreciating diversity is a fundamental aspect of promoting equity in organizations and communities. By recognizing and valuing the unique experiences and challenges faced by individuals from underrepresented or marginalized groups, diversity appreciation serves as a foundation for addressing systemic inequalities. Turner and González argued that organizations that prioritize diversity appreciation are more likely to implement policies and practices that promote fairness, reduce discrimination, and create opportunities for individuals from diverse backgrounds to thrive.

The role of diversity appreciation in addressing implicit biases and stereotypes cannot be understated. According to a study by Dovidio et al. (2021), individuals who actively engage in appreciating diversity are more likely to challenge their own biases and stereotypes about others. This process of self-reflection is critical in dismantling unconscious prejudices that often perpetuate discrimination and exclusion in various social contexts. Dovidio et al. found that organizations and institutions that emphasize diversity appreciation are more successful in creating inclusive environments where individuals from different backgrounds can collaborate effectively without fear of discrimination or bias.

The psychological benefits of diversity appreciation have also been explored in recent research. For instance, Huo and Molina (2020) found that individuals who perceive their social environments as appreciating diversity experience greater psychological well-being and a sense of belonging. This sense of belonging is essential for fostering positive social interactions and reducing feelings of alienation or exclusion. Huo and Molina highlighted that in organizations where diversity is appreciated, employees are more likely

to feel valued for their unique contributions, leading to higher levels of job satisfaction, engagement, and retention. Despite its numerous benefits, diversity appreciation is not without its challenges. One of the key obstacles to fostering diversity appreciation is resistance to change. As Shore et al. (2019) pointed out, individuals who are accustomed to homogenous environments may struggle to embrace diversity, especially when it challenges their existing beliefs or norms. Overcoming this resistance requires sustained efforts in education, training, and dialogue aimed at increasing awareness and understanding of the value of diversity. Additionally, organizations must be proactive in addressing structural barriers to diversity appreciation, such as discriminatory policies or practices that perpetuate exclusion.

Impact of Social Studies Education on Cultural Awareness

Social Studies education plays a significant role in promoting cultural awareness by providing learners with the knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary for understanding and appreciating cultural diversity. The primary goal of Social Studies is to equip students with a well-rounded perspective of societal issues, including the ways in which different cultures shape human behavior, beliefs, and social interactions. By examining cultural practices, historical backgrounds, and socio-political structures, Social Studies education helps individuals develop empathy, tolerance, and a more inclusive worldview (Adeyemi & Adeyinka, 2019). Through a multidisciplinary approach that incorporates elements of history, geography, sociology, and political science, Social Studies fosters an understanding of cultural differences and similarities, preparing students to engage constructively in a multicultural world.

The promotion of cultural awareness is an essential outcome of Social Studies education, particularly in increasingly globalized and multicultural societies. As Ghosh (2021) argues, understanding cultural diversity is crucial for fostering social cohesion and reducing ethnic and racial tensions. Cultural awareness allows individuals to appreciate the values, customs, and traditions of people from different backgrounds, reducing prejudice and fostering mutual respect. Social Studies curricula often include topics such as world history, cultural geography, and global citizenship, all of which provide students with opportunities to learn about and reflect on the cultural practices and histories of people from around the world. CHAPTER THREE

METHODOLOGY

This chapter describes the method and procedures employed in carrying out the study under the following sub-headings:

Design of the Study

This study adopted the descriptive survey research design. This design was employed for the study because the study sought to describe an already existing phenomenon - The Impact of Social Studies Education on Students' Cultural Awareness and Diversity Appreciation (ISSESCADA).

Population of the Study

The population of this study comprised all the public junior secondary school students in the twelve public junior secondary schools in Egor Local Government Area of Edo State. The population of this study include five hundred (500) JSS III students in Egor Local Government.

Sample and Sampling Technique

The sample for this study is one hundred junior secondary students. The sampling technique is the simple random technique. The sample size was gotten through simple random sampling technique.

Research Instrument

The instrument used in the study is the questionnaire (The Impact of Social Studies Education on Students' Cultural Awareness and Diversity Appreciation (ISSESCADA). It was designed to elicit responses that can provide answers to the research questions. The questionnaire is made up of two sections. The section A consists of information about the respondent such as gender and level of study while section B was designed to enable the researcher gather information relating to the research questions raised for the Study.

Validity of the Instrument

The questionnaire was given to the researcher's supervisor and two other experts in Curriculum and Instructional Technology for scrutiny, corrections, and suggestions. The corrections and suggestions made by them were incorporated into the final draft of the instrument. This was done to ensure that the instrument meets content and face validity.

Reliability of the Instrument

In other to determine the reliability of the instrument, it was administered to 20 Jss 3 of similar characteristics as those in the study. The results of their responses were correlated and a Cronbach coefficient of .83 was obtained. This shows that the instrument is reliable.

Method of Data Collection

The researcher will personally administer the questionnaire to the respondents and collect it immediately on the spot. This would be done to ensure that no questionnaire is missing. Prior to distribution, the researcher will obtain permission from relevant authorities and explain the purpose of the study to the respondents to ensure their cooperation. Additionally, follow-up visits would be made to clarify any ambiguities and ensure that all sections of the questionnaire are properly filled out.

Method of Data Analysis

This study used descriptive analysis. Descriptive statistics is used to summarize the characteristics of all variables in the administered questionnaires in order to present the data in a more meaningful way, which allowed simpler interpretation of the data. The collected data were analyzed using frequency count, mean score and standard deviation.

To interpret the results, a decision rule was applied. The criterion mean for this study was set at 2.50. This threshold determined whether students collectively accepted or did not accept each statement as significantly impacting their Cultural Awareness and Diversity Appreciation. Items with a mean score of 2.50 or above were classified as “Accepted,” suggesting that a significant portion of the respondents agreed with the statement, recognizing it as a relevant factor. On the other hand, items with mean scores below 2.50 were labelled as “Not Accepted,” indicating that Social Studies education does not influence there cultural awareness and diversity appreciation.

CHAPTER FOUR

DATA ANALYSIS AND DISCUSSION OF FINDINGS

This chapter presents the result obtained from the analysis of data for answering the research questions formulated and testing the hypotheses for the study through structured interview, checklist and observation schedule. The data are presented in tables and are arranged according to research questions and hypotheses.

Presentation of Result

Research Question 1: How does Social Studies Education Influence Students' Understanding of Cultural Diversity?

The data presented in Table 1 offers an insightful interpretation of how Social Studies education influences students' understanding of cultural diversity. The table outlines the responses of 100 students, using a Likert scale, to assess their level of

agreement with statements related to their understanding of cultural diversity as a result of Social Studies education. The first item, "Social studies helps me understand different cultures," has a mean score of 3.20, indicating that most students agree that Social Studies plays a significant role in enhancing their understanding of various cultures. The second item, "Social studies has improved my knowledge of other cultures," also shows a high mean score of 3.14. Students generally agreed that Social Studies has positively influenced their cultural knowledge. On the third item, "Social studies makes me respect cultures that are different from mine," students reported a mean score of 2.79. Although the mean is slightly lower compared to the previous two items, the decision remains agree, indicating that Social Studies education fosters respect for cultural differences. The fourth item, "Social studies helps me learn about cultural traditions," has a mean score of 2.59. In this case, students generally agree with the statement, suggesting that while Social Studies enhances their general understanding of cultural diversity, it might not delve deeply enough into the specific traditions of different cultures. Lastly, the fifth item, "Social studies classes help me understand why cultural diversity is important," has a mean score of 3.02. This item also results in an agree decision, indicating that students acknowledge the role of Social Studies in imparting the significance of cultural diversity.

Research Question 2: What impact does social studies education have on students' appreciation for different languages and religions?

The data presented in Table 2 provides an analysis of the impact of Social Studies education on students' appreciation for different languages and religions. The table summarizes the responses of 100 students to various statements about how Social Studies education influences their views on linguistic and religious diversity. The first item, "Social studies helps me appreciate different languages," has a mean score of 3.33, indicating that students generally agree that Social Studies fosters an appreciation for linguistic diversity. This highlights the role of Social Studies in broadening students' perspectives on the importance of different languages in society. The second item, "Social studies teaches me to respect different religions," has a mean score of 3.34, which shows strong agreement among students regarding the subject's impact on religious tolerance. This suggests that Social Studies education is effective in promoting respect for various religious beliefs and practices. It underscores the importance of the subject in teaching students about religious diversity and fostering a more inclusive attitude. For the third item, "Social studies helps me understand why people follow different religions," students reported a mean score of 2.90. While there is still agreement, the score is somewhat lower compared to the first two items, indicating that while students acknowledge the role of Social Studies in explaining religious diversity, this aspect of the curriculum might not be as emphasized as the general

respect for different religions. In the fourth item, "Social studies helps me value people who speak different languages other than mine," the mean score is 2.77, indicating that students agree, though with a slightly lower intensity, that Social Studies encourages them to value linguistic diversity. This suggests that the subject plays a role in helping students appreciate individuals who speak languages other than their own, though there might be room for more focused engagement in this area. Lastly, the fifth item, "Social studies encourages me to accept religious differences," has a mean score of 2.85. While this item still results in an "AGREE" decision, the mean is slightly lower compared to the earlier statements about language and religion. This suggests that while Social Studies contributes to fostering acceptance of religious differences, this aspect might not be as prominently addressed as general religious respect and appreciation.

Research Question 3: In what ways do Social Studies Curricula Promote Empathy and Respect Towards Diverse Cultural Backgrounds among Students?

Table 3 provides valuable insights into how Social Studies curricula promote empathy and respect towards diverse cultural backgrounds among students. The first item, "Social studies makes me more respectful of other cultures," reveals a mean score of 3.41, indicating strong agreement among students. This suggests that Social Studies is highly effective in instilling respect for cultural diversity, underscoring the importance of this subject in fostering an inclusive attitude towards people from various cultural backgrounds. In the second item, "Social studies encourages me to care about people from different backgrounds," the mean score is 2.97. While students still agree with this statement, the slightly lower mean score compared to the first item suggests that while Social Studies does promote care for people from diverse backgrounds, the emphasis on this may not be as pronounced as respect for cultural diversity. However, the agreement reflects that the subject does contribute positively to students' social consciousness and emotional sensitivity towards others. The third item, "Social studies teaches me to respect different cultural practices," has a mean score of 2.87. This shows that students generally agree that Social Studies fosters respect for different cultural practices. However, the mean score, being lower than the previous items, may indicate that there is room for improvement in how the curriculum engages students with the nuances of cultural practices, encouraging a deeper respect and understanding. The fourth item, "Social studies helps me feel empathy for people from other countries," presents a mean score of 3.14. This shows that students agree that Social Studies contributes to building empathy towards individuals from other countries, reinforcing the role of the subject in promoting an emotional connection with people of diverse origins. The curriculum's focus on global understanding appears to

resonate well with students, helping them to develop a compassionate worldview. Finally, the fifth item, "Social studies teaches me to be kind to people of all cultures," also shows a mean score of 2.97, similar to the second item. The agreement here indicates that Social Studies encourages students to approach people from different cultures with kindness and openness, which aligns with the subject's goal of cultivating mutual respect and understanding across cultural boundaries.

Research Question 4: How do Students Perceive the Role of Social Studies Education in Shaping their attitudes Towards Multiculturalism?

Table 4 presents the perceptions of students regarding the role of Social Studies education in shaping their attitudes towards multiculturalism. The data provides insights into how students view the subject's influence on their openness and acceptance of cultural diversity. The first item, "Social studies makes me more open to learning about different cultures," shows a mean score of 2.74, indicating that students generally agree that Social

Studies fosters a greater openness to cultural learning. This suggests that the curriculum plays a role in motivating students to explore and understand cultures beyond their own, albeit the level of agreement is moderate. The second item, "Social studies encourages me to accept people from all backgrounds," has a higher mean score of 3.14, signifying stronger agreement among students. This suggests that Social Studies is effective in promoting inclusivity and acceptance of individuals from various backgrounds, reinforcing the subject's importance in creating a socially cohesive and multicultural-minded student body. For the third item, "Social studies changes my attitude towards people from other cultures," the mean score is 2.78. While students agree with this statement, the score reflects moderate agreement, implying that while Social Studies does influence students' attitudes towards individuals from different cultures, there might be room for the curriculum to further emphasize the transformation of these attitudes in a more impactful way. The fourth item, "Social studies teaches me to enjoy learning about different ways of life," also has a mean score of 2.74, showing moderate agreement. This suggests that Social Studies provides students with opportunities to appreciate different ways of life, but the level of enthusiasm for this aspect of the curriculum could potentially be enhanced to encourage greater engagement with multicultural learning. Lastly, the fifth item, "Social studies makes me more accepting of people from different cultural groups," with a mean score of 2.74. This indicates a moderate level of agreement, reinforcing the idea that while Social Studies plays a role in shaping students' acceptance of diverse cultural groups, there may be potential for further development in fostering a deeper sense of cultural acceptance.

Hypothesis One: *There is no significant relationship between social studies education and students' understanding of cultural diversity.*

Data for testing research hypothesis 1 are presented in table 5

Result: $r = .572$, $p = 0.021$. Results in Table 8 show the person correlation statistics on there is no significant relationship between social studies education and students' understanding of cultural diversity. It can be seen that the Pearson correlation coefficient, r is 0.572 and that is statistically significant ($p < 0.05$). Thus, the null hypothesis which states that there is no significant relationship between social studies education and students' understanding of cultural diversity is rejected. There was a moderate positive correlation between Social Studies Education and students' understanding of cultural diversity. Hence, Social Studies education should take priority so as to aid Students' understanding of cultural diversity.

Discussion of Findings

The findings from this study reveal that Social Studies plays a crucial role in shaping students' perceptions of cultural diversity and multiculturalism. The findings are consistent with previous studies that have highlighted the significance of Social Studies in promoting cultural awareness among students (Obioma & Ekpo, 2021; Adefemi & Oyeniyi, 2022). These studies have shown that the subject provides a platform for students to understand and appreciate the different cultural values, beliefs, and practices that exist in society. One of the most significant aspects of the findings is the role of Social Studies in fostering respect for cultural diversity. The students' responses demonstrate that they generally agree that Social Studies helps them respect cultures that are different from their own. This aligns with the findings of Okonkwo and Adeola (2023), who found that Social Studies education in secondary schools enhances students' ability to appreciate and respect cultural differences. These scholars argue that respect for cultural diversity is essential in promoting peaceful coexistence in a multicultural society, and Social Studies serves as a key vehicle for transmitting such values to students.

The study's findings highlight that Social Studies education contributes to students' understanding of the importance of cultural diversity. Students expressed agreement that Social Studies classes help them understand why cultural diversity is important, a conclusion supported by other researchers (Ibrahim & Daramola, 2021). According to Ibrahim and Daramola (2021), Social Studies plays a pivotal role in teaching students the value of cultural diversity, particularly in societies characterized by ethnic and cultural plurality. This understanding is critical in fostering unity in diversity, as students are

equipped with the knowledge and skills necessary to navigate cultural differences and build inclusive relationships.

Additionally, the findings indicate that Social Studies education encourages students to develop an open attitude toward learning about different cultures. The responses suggest that Social Studies fosters openness, which is fundamental to building a culturally inclusive society. This corroborates the work of Ojo (2022), who found that Social Studies curriculum helps students become more open to cultural exchange and learning. Ojo's research emphasizes that Social Studies creates an educational environment where students are exposed to the complexities of different cultures, leading them to become more accepting and less biased in their interactions with people from diverse backgrounds.

In terms of empathy and kindness toward people from other cultures, the study found that Social Studies education has a significant impact on students' emotional responses to cultural diversity. Several students agreed that Social Studies teaches them to care about and be kind to people from different cultural groups, which resonates with the findings of Adeyemi and Bello (2023). These scholars argue that Social Studies, through its emphasis on empathy and global citizenship, plays a crucial role in humanizing students' perceptions of people from other cultures. The curriculum, when properly implemented, enables students to develop compassion for individuals who may be culturally different from them, thereby reducing stereotypes and prejudices. Another finding from the study is that students perceive Social Studies as instrumental in shaping their attitudes toward multiculturalism. Many of the students agreed that Social Studies encourages them to accept people from different backgrounds, a conclusion supported by research conducted by Ogunsola and Idowu (2023). Their study revealed that Social Studies education

promotes an appreciation for multiculturalism by encouraging students to value the diversity of human experiences and identities. This aligns with the broader goals of Social Studies as an academic discipline, which seeks to prepare students to live in a globally interconnected and culturally diverse world.

Despite these positive findings, it is worth noting that some students expressed less agreement with items related to learning about cultural traditions. This suggests that while Social Studies successfully promotes general cultural awareness, there may be a need for a more focused exploration of specific cultural traditions and practices. As noted by Omole and Adebayo (2020), Social Studies curricula in many Nigerian schools tend to focus more on theoretical aspects of cultural diversity, with less emphasis on practical engagement with the traditions and practices of different cultural groups. Omole and Adebayo (2020) recommend incorporating more culturally immersive activities and real-life examples into the Social Studies curriculum to enhance students' understanding of cultural traditions.

The findings reveal that while Social Studies helps students appreciate different languages and religions, there is room for improvement in how the subject addresses these aspects of diversity. Previous research by Azeez and Amusa (2021) has similarly indicated that Social Studies education, though impactful in promoting cultural tolerance, often falls short in addressing linguistic and religious diversity in sufficient depth. Azeez and Amusa (2021) argue that the inclusion of more comprehensive lessons on linguistic and religious diversity would enrich students' understanding and foster greater respect for these critical components of cultural identity.

CHAPTER FIVE

SUMMARY, CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Summary

The study examined the Impact of Social Studies Education on Students' Cultural Awareness And Diversity Appreciation in Junior Secondary Schools in Egor Local Government Area. Four research questions were raised to guide this study. The study adopted the descriptive survey research design. The population of the study comprised of one hundred JSS 111 students in Egor Local Government Area of Edo State. The instrument used for data collection is a self-structured questionnaire. This instrument was validated by the project supervisor. The data gathered was analysed using mean score and standard deviation. The findings from the study is as follows:

1. The study revealed that Social Studies education significantly enhances students' understanding of cultural diversity, fostering respect and appreciation for different cultures.
2. The study showed that Social Studies education plays a key role in promoting tolerance and respect for linguistic and religious diversity among students, encouraging inclusivity.

3. The study highlighted that while Social Studies education contributes to empathy and respect for diverse cultural backgrounds, there is room for improvement in engaging students with specific cultural practices and traditions.
4. The study demonstrated that Social Studies education positively influences students' openness and acceptance of multiculturalism, though more emphasis is needed to deepen students' attitudes towards people from different cultural groups.

Conclusion

The findings of this study indicate that Social Studies education has a profound impact on students' cultural awareness and diversity appreciation in junior secondary schools within Egor Local Government Area. The subject promotes respect for cultural diversity, encourages openness to learning about different cultures, and fosters empathy and kindness toward people from various backgrounds. However, there is still room for improvement in areas such as the exploration of cultural traditions and the inclusion of more content on linguistic and religious diversity.

Recommendations

Having carefully analysed the study and obtained definite results, the following recommendations are made:

1. Social Studies Education students should actively engage with cultural diversity topics, participating in discussions and activities that deepen their understanding and appreciation of different cultures, languages, and religions.
2. Lecturers should incorporate more practical and interactive methods in Social Studies lessons, such as cultural exchange programs and case studies, to better immerse students in the learning of diverse cultural traditions and practices.

3. School administrators should support the implementation of programs that promote multicultural awareness, such as cultural days and collaborative projects, to create a more inclusive school environment that fosters respect for diversity.
4. Policy makers should revise the Social Studies curriculum to ensure a more comprehensive coverage of cultural diversity, linguistic appreciation, and religious tolerance, with clear emphasis on practical applications in students' daily lives.
5. Future researchers should investigate the long-term effects of Social Studies education on students' cultural attitudes and behaviors, as well as investigate how specific teaching strategies can further enhance cultural awareness and appreciation.
