ABSTRACT

This study investigated the impact of Instructional Materials in the teaching and learning of adult education in the University of Benin. The purpose of the study was to find out the effectiveness of Instructional Materials in the teaching of Adult Education in University of Benin Edo State. Five research questions were raised. The research instrument was questionnaire. The population of study covered all adult education students in the University of Benin. Simple random sampling technique was used to select One hundred and five (105) students.
